

Goal	Joint Attention <ul style="list-style-type: none"> () demonstrates joint attention with the communication partner. () demonstrates visual/auditory/physical attention to AAC system by quieting, orienting or moving in to action.
Set Up	Page Set: Pick Items <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Note: This moves through 6 different scenes from which to pick items.
Initiate Activity	You: (Christmas tree scene) Look at all the stars on the tree! I wonder how many there are. Would you help me count them? AAC: Chooses a star on the tree (it disappears and makes a sound)
Maintain Turns	You: Oh, it makes a sound too when you catch it. That is one star. How many are left? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Encourage user to select another star again increasing prompting as necessary. Repeat engagement as you continue to count the stars. Can repeat this idea as you move through additional scenes.
Wrap Up	You: (After you have counted all the stars) That was fun! I think there is another scene that we can pick items and count together. Would you like find out what it is? Or Would you like to play again? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Wait to see if responds with acceptance or rejection. If indicates "yes", repeat same type of engagement through different scenes. You could encourage user to select the arrow to change the scene (navigation). Be sure to talk about the items in the scene, expanding on vocabulary as you play.

Success Tip: Customize images or sounds

- Open the Quick Menu and Select edit button tool.
- Choose the button outlined in red to edit.
- Change the background image, the images to "pick" and/or sound.
 - You can move the location of the images to "pick" to put in a different place on the scene.

Next Steps:

- Adding a single message button to the activity, will allow the communicator the ability to demonstrate intent to communicate with a partner.
- You might add a button (or more) with a message such as "All done", "More", or "This is fun!"
 - Select Edit Page Set from the Quick menu
 - Select the Button Tool and draw a button in a corner
 - Select the Edit Button's Content tool
 - Type in the Button Text
 - Choose a symbol
 - At the bottom of the page, select Speak Text on Button and select SAVE.
 - Choose View and Select Run.
